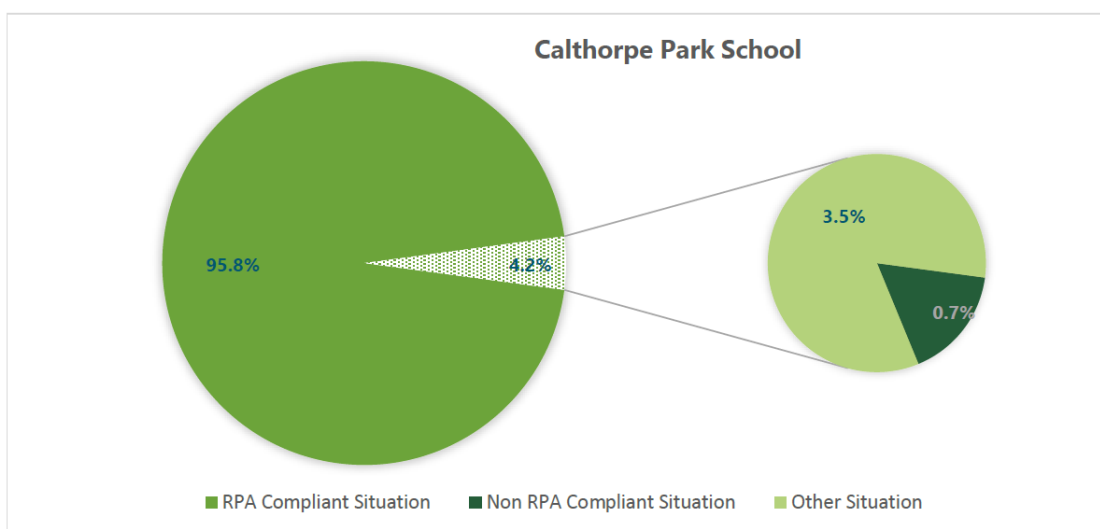


Calthorpe Park School 2023-24 Destination Data¹

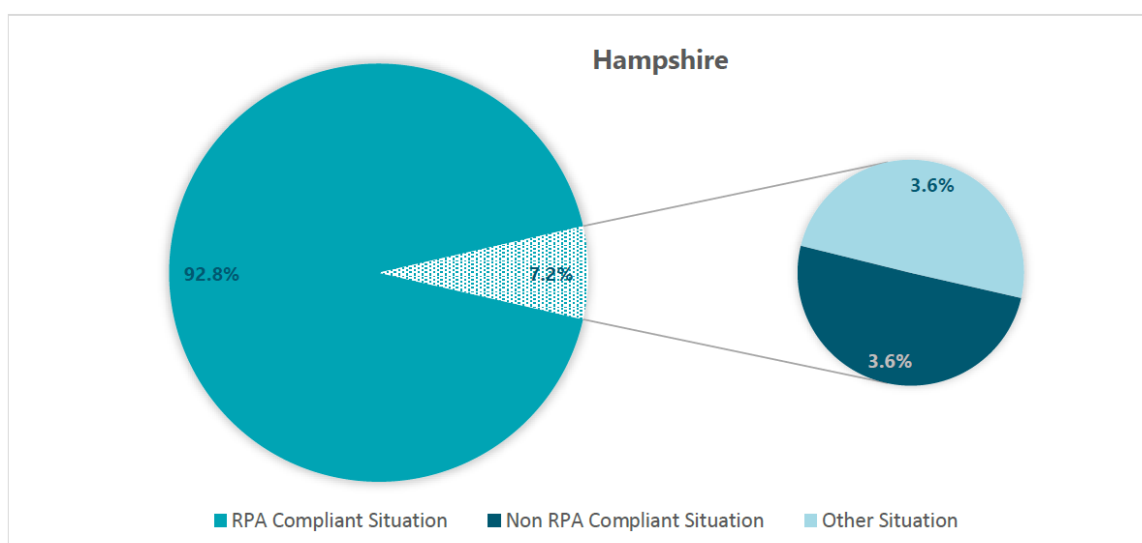
Due to Raising the Participation Age (RPA) legislation 2014, young people are under a duty to participate in education or training until at least their 18th birthday, although in practice most young people continue until the end of the academic year in which they turn 18 (academic Year 13). This significant piece of education legislation has particular importance to vulnerable young people. Primary responsibility for providing independent and impartial careers guidance on participation options rests with establishments directly.

Situation Overview

The chart below shows that 95.8% of Calthorpe Park School Year 11s in 2024 moved to participating situations that meet the DfE defined 'Raising the Participation Age (RPA)'. Of the remaining 4.2%, 0.7% moved to Non RPA situations and 3.5% to Other situations. The 'Other' category includes young people who are working towards participation, on a temporary break, unable to engage due to personal reasons as well as those whose situation is unknown or who have moved out of the area.



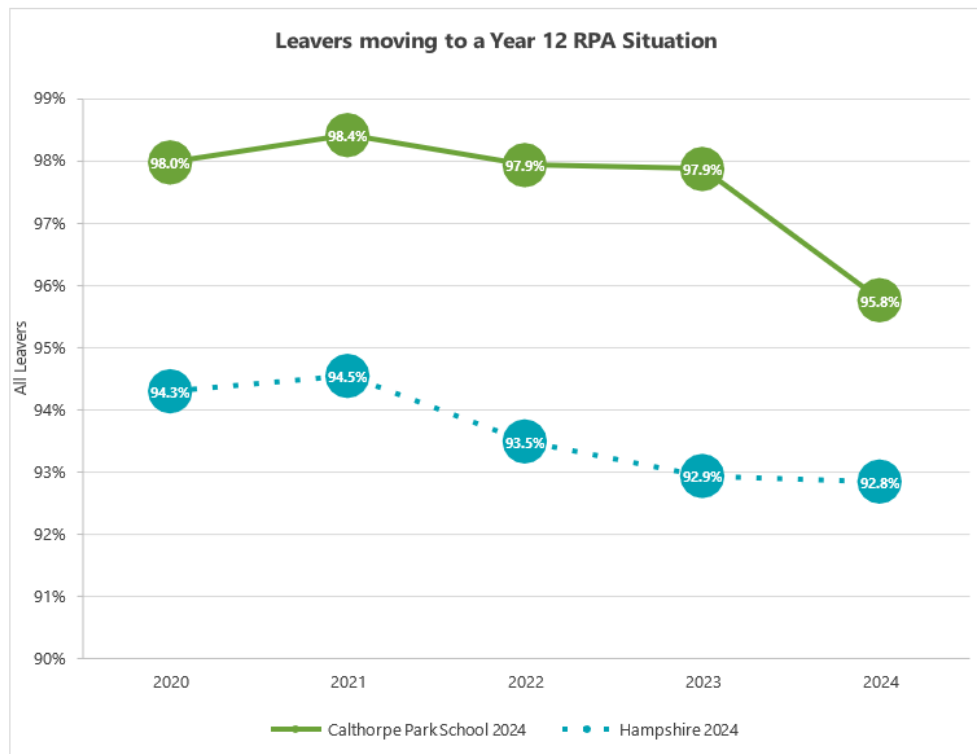
The same chart showing the total Hampshire cohort indications that 92.8% of Hampshire Year 11 leavers moved to RPA situations in 2024. The RPA percentage for Calthorpe Park School is higher than that for Hampshire.

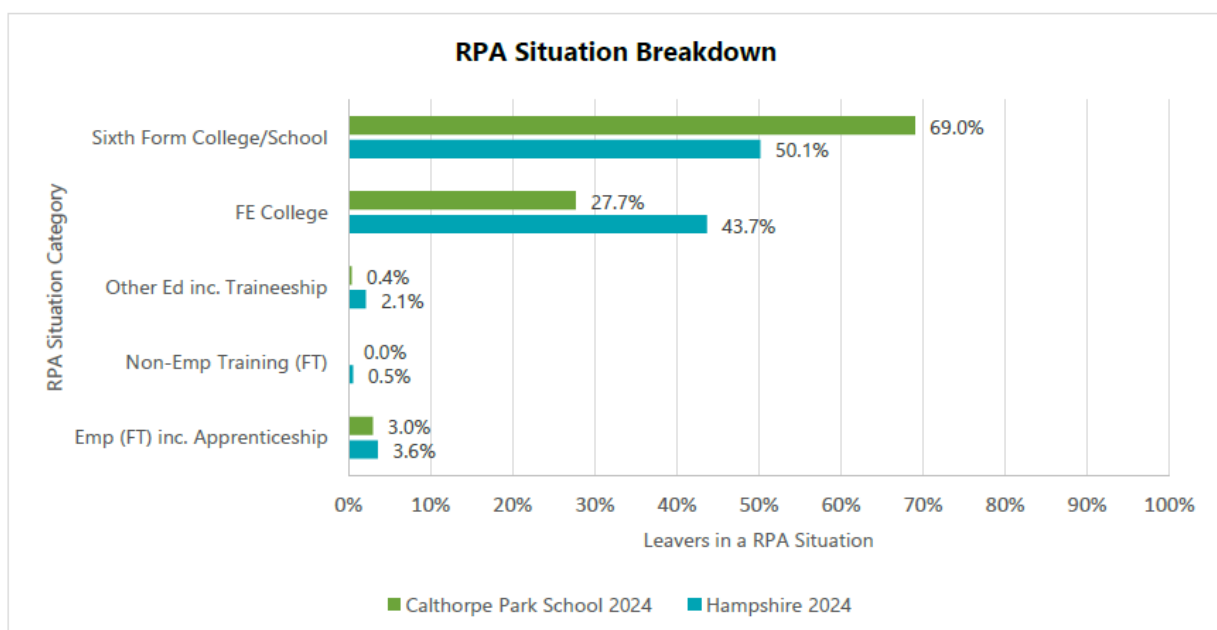
Raising the Participation Age (RPA) Situations

The graph below shows the percentage of leavers from Calthorpe Park School who moved to a RPA situation in Year 12. It shows percentages for the past five years, and compares these to the Hampshire percentages over the same time period.



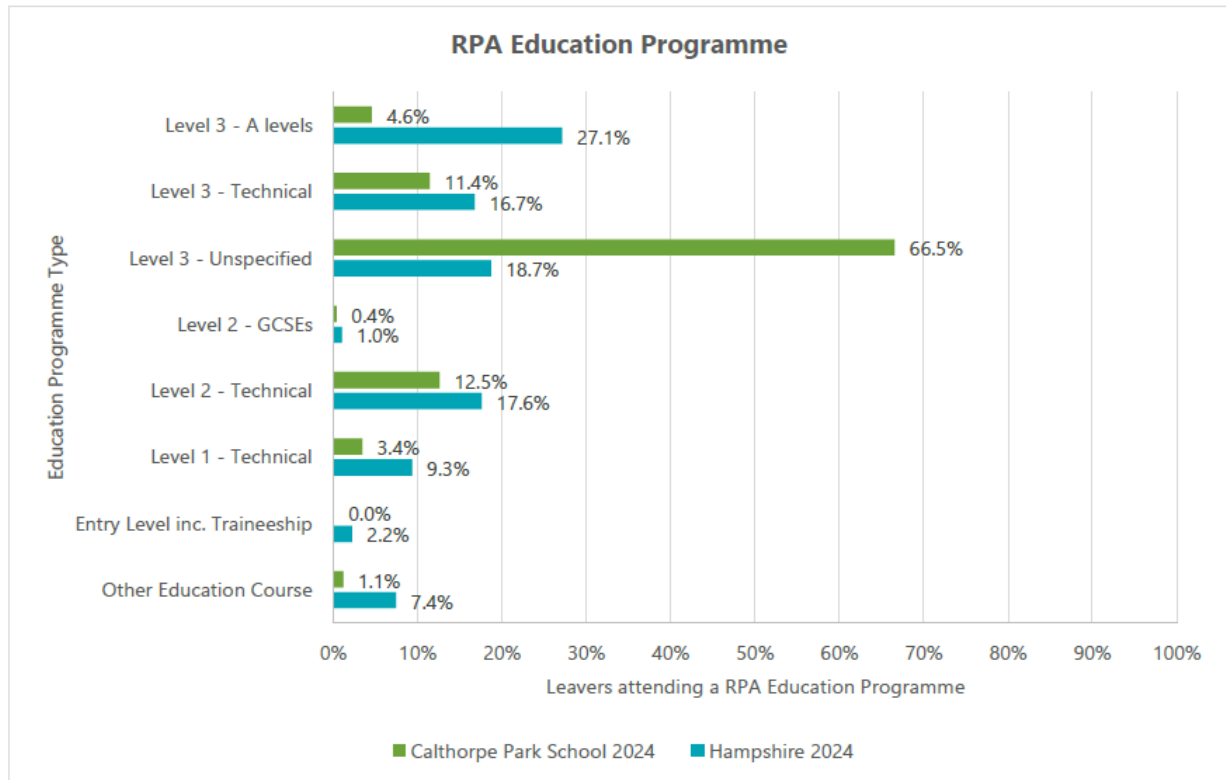
RPA Situation Breakdown

RPA situations are grouped into five categories, seen below. The graph below shows that there is a larger percentage of Calthorpe Park School leavers moving to an education programme ('Sixth Form College/School', 'FE College', 'Other Ed inc. Traineeship') than the Hampshire average, but a smaller percentage moving to a training situation.



RPA Education Programme

There are different types of education programmes. The bar chart below shows that a higher percentage of education programme leavers from Calthorpe Park School moved on to study a Level 3 programme than the Hampshire average. A lower percentage moved to Technical programmes than the Hampshire average.



RPA Programme Establishments

Certain factors can greatly influence the appeal of a post-16 education establishment, such as the type of courses offered.

The figures include young people repeating a year of statutory education. Establishments with fewer than five people attending are not shown.

Year 12 Establishments	Leavers from Calthorpe Park School	% of Programme Leavers
The Sixth Form College Farnborough	172	65.4%
Farnborough College of Technology	40	15.2%
Basingstoke College of Technology	18	6.8%

Year 11 leavers from Calthorpe Park School moving to an education programme also attended Queen Mary's College and Alton College.
