### SLUGG WALK 2023

As Heads of Charities, we are delighted to announce that the annual SLUGG Walk will be returning to the CPS events calendar at the end of term.

On **Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> July**, we will be holding SLUGG Walk, with a special focus on **‘the origins of SLUGG Walk’**. For those who do not know, SLUGG stands for Sri Lanka, Uganda, Ghana and Gambia and for that reason the two charities we will be raising money for are:

- [CAMFED](#) the Campaign for Female Education, aims to provide young African women with a route to the future they imagine for themselves, their community and Africa as a whole.
- [Ocean Stars](#) a charity that empowers Sri Lankan children through education, in particular those children of preschool and primary school age.

Period 1	As normal- please bring equipment
Period 2	As normal- please bring equipment
Period 3 11.00 - 11.35	Shortened lesson- please bring equipment
Period 4 11.35 - 12.05	Return to tutor time for a shortened lesson on Origins of SLUGG Walk with a quiz prepared by SSLT
Lunch 12.05 - 12.35	Slightly shortened lunch and <b>no access to the playground</b>
Period 5 12.35 - 1.50	All students return to tutor group for registration. Tutors lead their tutor group to their relevant location: <i>Emerald, Amethyst and Topaz</i> will assemble in the Courtyard for SLUGG Sound. <i>Ruby, Quartz and Sapphire</i> will go to their House assigned starting points areas for the walk.
Period 6 1.50 - 3.00	<i>Ruby, Quartz and Sapphire</i> to SLUGG Sound. <i>Emerald, Amethyst and Topaz</i> to stalls and SLUGG Walk

Whilst following the pre-assigned SLUGG Walk, students will spend time at the various activities and stalls along the route. These stalls include classic fairground games such as the infamous ‘Splat the Teacher’ and ‘doughnut on a string’, along with face painting, a photobooth and a bake sale. SLUGG Sound will host a variety of live musical student performances that can be enjoyed in a relaxed and informal setting in the Courtyard. As indicated in the table above, each group of houses will spend 1 hour and 10 minutes at each of the main events. Students will be dismissed at normal time.



As this is a charity event, we have a **suggested donation of £3 per student** as a flat entry fee to the Fun Fair stalls and access to the SLUGG Sound area. This donation should be paid via **student ScoPay accounts**. Students will be **permitted to bring additional cash to buy food and drinks**. Items of food and drink will range from **50p-£2** and we ask that cash is brought in denominations of 50p. Food will also still be available at break and lunch as usual in the café. We would also be very grateful for donations for the Chocolate Tombola, this may be chocolate or sweets and can be delivered to the School Reception any time prior to the event.

**SLUGG Sound** will be returning this year for the first time since 2019. We have recently held auditions and have a brilliant line up of student performers, as well as some brave teachers all showcasing their talent. SLUGG Sound is such a vibrant and exciting part of SLUGG Walk and we are looking forward to its return, and hope that you are too.

An alternative setting will be provided for those students who may find SLUGG Walk rather overwhelming. Our ELSA team will be welcoming anyone preferring an area of peace and quiet in which to enjoy the afternoon.

This event is a great opportunity to celebrate the end of the academic year and recognise the hard work and commitment of our school community as a whole. We would like to remind all students that exemplary behaviour is expected, and poor conduct will not be tolerated. Please be aware that those students who receive significant sanctions in the week leading up to SLUGG Walk will not be permitted to take part, but will instead spend the afternoon in the Reflection Room, supervised by a senior member of staff.

This year SLUGG Walk **will NOT be a non-uniform day**. However, in anticipation of warmer weather and to ensure general comfort during the activities, students are welcome to wear their **school PE kit** for the day. As this is an outdoor event, we would like to remind students to apply sun-cream and fill reusable water bottles ahead of the activities commencing.

We are very much looking forward to seeing the return of SLUGG Walk and thank you in advance for your support!
